SAY IT WITH FLOWERS

In 1920 a Glasgow florist Joe Dobson and a nursery-man Carl Englemann from Saffron Walden were looking to increase their business. Taking an idea from the USA they set up what was to become, in 1953, Interflora with the famous strap-line 'Say it with flowers'.

We use flowers to say many things. According to the British Florist Association we give alstroemeria to thank someone for their devotion; chrysanthemum to wish the recipient joy and happiness, perhaps in their new home; a yellow rose to express the value of friendship; and of course a red rose to express eternal love.

On 6 and 7 October Aldham Church is going to 'Say it with flowers'. Most of us are familiar with the church as the place where we say it with God's Word, and we say it in the Sacrament. In our Flower Festival, in a day or so, we are going to 'Say it with flowers', flowers skilfully arranged by members of the Colchester Group of Flower Arrangers to say what a Wonderful World God has given us. Each arrangement will develop a verse or verses in the Bible that speak of God's love for us. Some arrangements will be given in memory of a loved one.

We hope you will be able to come and appreciate the flowers, browse the stalls and sustain the inner man or woman with the all-day refreshments. All proceeds from the Flower Festival are for the appeal for Fabric Repairs, as described in the enclosed leaflet.

Say it with flowers is also the name of a little known 1934 British film. Kate, a flower-seller in the Old Kent Road falls ill and is prescribed a stay at the seaside. Fellow stallholders and music hall stars who buy their flowers from Kate rally round and stage a musical to raise funds so that Kate may head for the seaside.

On 2 September Peter Dale from Open Door came to our Harvest Thanksgiving Service, and gave a compelling talk about the work of the drop-in centre at the Eld Lane Baptist Church. He had asked for gifts of the kind of food they needed, and as a result, Peter filled the back of his estate car with items that were donated.

GONG OF PRAISE FOR MODERN HYMN WRITER

Keith Getty, one of the world's most prolific and acclaimed writers of modem hymns, received his OBE from the Queen on Tuesday 3 July to mark his contribution to church music.

His best-known hymn, *In Christ Alone*, was chosen as the second-best hymn of all time in a survey for the BBC's Songs of Praise in 2013, and is sung every year by an estimated 100 million people around the world. It was written with Stuart Townend and was used for the enthronement of the Archbishop of Canterbury. Popular with Christians of all denominations, it was also chosen by the Pope for use during his visit to Ireland in August.

Getty, from Lisburn in Northern Ireland, has written about 70 of the top 2,000 hymns sung in the UK. and 31 of the top 500. He says that in the past decade there has been a huge growth in demand for contemporary hymns that draw on traditional and Celtic melodies. Getty says that his music is also influenced by George Gershwin and Johann Sebastian Bach.

When he and his wife Kristyn began to publish their music in 2000 there was little interest from record companies, amid forecasts that hymn singing would decline. "Today there is an unprecedented growth in Christianity around the world, especially in big cities," Getty says. "There has never been a greater need for hymns that are deep and cultural and beautiful."
